

Tips for starting a conversation on caring for our environment and climate:


- Use relatable, simple, straight-forward language to explain climate basics.

In **CCC: Call of the Giant Eagle**, children are immersed in the story of Te Hokio, a mysterious creature from New Zealand. Filled with animation, music and sound on every page, players discover new critters and save the forest from mechanical machines.



The **Earth Cubs** app has a wide range of interactive and engaging games, puzzles, videos, and comics to learn about the environment. In partnership with Rainforest Trust UK, as kids play and learn they are rewarded with real-world tree protection.



Energy Transformers is a fun, immersive and educational mobile game designed for students 9-14. Students are given a positive way to learn about renewable energy, air pollution and climate solutions in Australia - with the topics aligned with science.
